The WLAM Foundation enjoyed another very successful year of supporting women's education, raising over \$45,000 for scholarships. The success of the Foundation is largely based on the exceptional talent of its Board of Directors, comprised in 2008-09 of Dawn Van Hoek (Chair), Paula M. Talarico (Treasurer), Sandra L. Sorini (Secretary), Lori D. Becker, Z. Kay Fitzpatrick, Nancy Glen, Karen Maheu, Markeisha Miner, Alice McCann Osburn, Meghan Kennedy Riordan, and Ann L. Routt. The Foundation lost in early 2008 its dear friend and long-time Treasurer, Kimberly M. Cahill, gone but far from forgotten. Kim's sparkle, intelligence and commitment to women's issues continue to inspire us all.

Fundraising in 2008-09 took the forms of dues check-offs and direct donations from WLAM members (approx. \$2100), donations through the Foundation's art project (\$0), event sponsorship (\$1000), the Parisian Community Day event (\$362), the First Annual Culinary Challenge (\$2200), the "Dean's List" giving campaign (approx. \$43,000), and the newly-created Kimberly M. Cahill Fund (\$2100).
